GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES

Employee in this position performs general mechanical repair and maintenance of all equipment and vehicles used in County Government. Employee works under the direction of and is responsible to the Shop Superintendent.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE POSITION

The distinguishing features and some specific examples of the duties of the position include but are not limited to:

- Repairs and/or replaces all lights on equipment
- Performs some diesel repair or maintenance when necessary
- Performs other duties as required or assigned

GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge of the standard practices, materials, tools and equipment used in servicing, maintaining and repairing automotive, construction and related equipment; knowledge of operating principles of gasoline and diesel engines and of the standard mechanical components of automotive, construction and related equipment; knowledge of the occupational hazards and safety precautions of equipment repair work in conjunction with Shop Operations; ability to perform heavy manual labor associated with various work assignment; ability to follow oral and written instructions; ability to establish and maintain an effective working relationship with other employees.

SPECIFIC MINIMUM TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE

MUST be a high school graduate or equivalent (GED) with 4-5 years previous experience in automotive (gas and diesel) mechanics; MUST have at least 3 years experience with changing and/or repairing tires on county vehicles and medium to heavy equipment; MUST have 3 years experience doing minor to medium repairs on road equipment as well as other county government vehicles on the side of the road and in shop if needed; MUST have current CDL's with Hazmat Endorsements to be able to do fueling for all county equipment.
